Howard Morgan: Entrusting Ourselves to I AM

"Thy will be is done" the "most dangerous prayer" a believer can utter, Dr. Howard Morgan told worshippers gathered at His Place on Sunday. October 30. this Speaking prayer in earnest



begins a process of testing and trial, so that God can replace our "I want" with His "I Am" in our lives.

Morgan, founder of Howard Morgan Ministries and Kingdom Ministries International, shared the Word at His Place Worship Center Saturday night, October 29, and the following Sunday morning.

Continuing the Sunday morning message, Morgan said we must be willing to place ourselves on God's operating table to so He can remove out self-centeredness. This surgery is painful. But "only those who have gone through this process can rule and reign" in God's kingdom.

Our western culture encourages church leaders to seek growth and unity by trying to please participants, Morgan noted. Sermons are limited to 20 minutes and worship services to an hour. Song choices are based on the likes and dislikes of the congregation. Music and dancing are added for entertainment value.

In contrast, "it's not entertaining when the Spirit comes; it's scary," he said. Yet we don't routinely pray, "Oh scary God, come into us.""

"I believe God wants to change the whole face" of church operations, Morgan said. Leaders shouldn't seek primarily to fill large auditoriums, but to carry out on the church's "true business" of training disciples. "Every one of us is called to be a disciple and make disciples."

He said each of us can disciple someone around us – even if the person's growth period in Christ is only a week less than ours. "Discipling is no more than helping someone learn what you already know."

Believing that "Jesus is Lord and I'm not" also means we grow in unity. Morgan lamented our nation's divided, denominational Christianity.

However, unification doesn't mean that, in line with our western, people-pleasing mentality, we back off just to avoid conflict, he said. "That may be Christian, but it's not Kingdom." Unity "is not based on our theological agreement," but on following Christ.

Morgan, a messianic Jew, advocated the traditional Hebraic, "iron sharpens iron," method of studying scripture. Learners raise questions and discuss – even argue – points of scripture. Multiple viewpoints are considered valid. The teacher's ("Rabbi's") attitude would be "You know, I could be wrong, but let's study together."

Church leaders who use this method "create an environment that lets the gifts come out" of the church body.

Morgan noted that "so many churches don't know the history of the church and the Jewish people." The truth is that "Jesus, the Jewish Messiah, didn't come to start a new religion called Christianity. He came to bring the nations to God."

And, Morgan asserted, "before the Lord comes," all followers of Christ "will be one."

Preparing for the Messiah's Birth

With the Christmas season approaching, the His Place children spent October experiencing prophecies of the coming King.

The coming Prince of Peace

Unto us a son is given.....

On Sunday, October 2, the children learned that a prophet speaks the words God gives him, often proclaiming what

God plans for the future. They learned that Isaiah prophesied Jesus' birth, and they made mini-megaphones bearing Isaiah's words "Unto us a son is given." They also learned that Isaiah said the coming king would be called "Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6, NLT).

Thy kingdom come....

The children learned, on October 9, that when Jesus' kingdom is fulfilled, it will be safe for children to lead around fierce animals such as lions. Also, "the baby will play safely near the hole of a cobra. Yes, a little child



will put its hand in a nest of deadly snakes without harm." And "nothing will hurt or destroy in all my holy mountain." (Passages are from Isaiah 11:8-9, NLT). The kids made and decorated snake finger puppets.

Thou anointest my bear with oil



On October 16, the kids took turns anointing "Beary," a stuffed bear, with oil. They learned that Jesus was sent as the anointed king, or Messiah. The kids created and put on jeweled crowns displaying the words "Jesus Messiah Christos."

He walks with me and He talks with me

Through Jesus, or "Immanuel," God lives with us. That was the subject of the Sunday School lesson on October 23. The younger children made mini-scrolls displaying the words of Isaiah 7:14: "Look! The virgin will conceive a

child! She will give birth to a son and will call him Immanuel" (NLT). The older children drew pictures of what the world would be like without Jesus.



Hopelessness and resurrection

On October 30, the Sunday before Hallowe'en, the kids learned how God can bring dry bones – and dry hopes – to life. Jesus also brings us to life through His resurrection. As the teacher read

> Ezekiel 37:1 -14, the kids acted out the story of the valley of dry bones. They



rattled maracas as the bones rattled, and danced when the bones came to life.

The children also assembled a skeleton from a stack of card stock "bones," and played a game of "Freeze Dry Bones/Live Dry Bones." Kids, His Place needs your voices to proclaim the joy of Christ through this year's Christmas musical. Rehearsals will be after each Sunday worship service, for about an hour.

The musical, "Joy to You and Me," will be directed by Pat Epley, assisted by Marion Stephan. Participation will give our children the chance to profess Christ through "the gifts of song, dance, and acting—gifts I've seen our children demonstrate in Sunday School and worship services," says Marion Stephan.

Parents, we urge you to bring your kids to rehearsals. Our kids deserve the chance to use their talents to proclaim the Christ whose birth we celebrate at Christmas.
