Children's Ministry

Our children study Jesus's parables: repentance, joy, humility, and prayer

We can bring joy to heaven

New Year's Day and snow hindered Sunday School on the first two Sundays of January. However,

the children plunged back into action January 15 with a lesson on the joy God feels when sinners repent. The kids learned that, just as the woman rejoiced when she found her lost coin, "there is joy in the



presence of God's angels when even one sinner repents" (Luke 15:10).

The children decorated two-sided Greek coins inscribed with Luke 15:9 on one side and Luke 15:10 on the other. They also took turns digging up 10 card stock coins buried in salt. Then they unscrambled the letters printed on the coins to reveal how God feels when a sinner repents: "He is joyful."

On January 22, the children took turns reading, out loud, a series of boasts. As each boast was read, one child puffed into a balloon, until the balloon's inevitable POP.

This activity introduced the children to the boastful Pharisee and the repentant tax collector described in Luke 18:9-14.



The children also applied markers, jeweled stickers, and creativity to "If you want to boast, boast only about the Lord" posters.

The radiance of prayer

The following Sunday, January 29, the children blended corn syrup, water, beads, and metallic confetti



in plastic bottles. These "prayer bottles," when shaken, demonstrated how the radiance of prayer infuses our lives.

The children learned that unlike the unjust judge in

Luke 18:1-8, God listens when we pray. "So don't you think God will surely give justice to his chosen people who cry out to him day and night?" (Luke 18:7)
