# Remembering Christ's Sacrifice


"A tree stands strong not by its fruits or branches, but by the depth of its roots."

Anthony Liccione, an American poet and author

"...(R)emember that you do not support the root, but the root supports you." – Romans 11:18

When His Place celebrates the Sedar meal ceremony on Resurrection Sunday, it will be a remembrance of our roots in God's first act of His nation's deliverance: the Passover. The Hebrew tradition of sacrificing a Passover lamb fulfilled in the sacrifice of the Lamb of God thousands of years after the first Exodus.

We who have been "grafted into" God's kingdom should remember that we are truly alive only because of Jesus Christ's sacrifice. Jesus declared, during his last





Passover with His disciples, that the unleavened bread "is my body which is given for you" (Luke 22:19). The wine "is the new testament in my blood, which is shed for you" (Luke 22:20).

Poet T.S. Elliot, alluding to com-

munion, calls "(t)he dripping blood our only drink" and "(t) he bloody flesh our only food" ("East

Coker," *The Four Quartets*). What do we have to sustain us except that Jesus gave His body and blood for us?

The author of Hebrews points out that symbols - such as the Holy of Holies - and symbolic acts, such as the priest's annual sacrifice for sin, serve a purpose. But the temple, the Holy of Holies, and sacrifices are simply copies of the realities of heaven. "For Christ has not entered the holy places made with hands, which are copies of the

true, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us" (Hebrews 9:24).

Old Testament animal sacrifices pointed to the promise of Jesus's ultimate act of sacrifice. Our reenactment of the Sedar and, through communion, Jesus's Passover sacrifice for us, remind us of what God in Christ has done and will do. But even these ceremonies pale when compared to final realities. "Christ was offered once to bear the sins of many. To those who eagerly wait

for Him He will appear a second time, apart from sin, for salva-

tion" (Hebrews 9:28).

When this happens, according to the apostle Paul, "the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first" (1 Thessalonians 4:16).

And we will emerge from what CS Lewis calls the "shadowlands" into "a new heaven and a new earth" (Revelation 21:1).
